Twenty-three unfired bullets.

The Battle of Gettysburg was one of the bloodiest battles of the Civil War. 16,000 were killed, wounded or captured on

July 1 - 3, 1863.

A dead soldier was discovered on that battlefield with 23 unfired bullets jammed into a single rifle barrel. How is that possible?

Many Civil War rifles were old technology. Required many steps to prepare, load and fire a single shot. A cartridge with powder and bullet was jammed into the top of the barrel with a ramrod. This required either standing or kneeling upright. That position made them a much bigger target. Plus, it took at least 20 seconds to prepare and shoot. Under perfectly calm circumstances.

Imagine trying to follow all of these steps while the enemy is charging you! You can understand the panic that might cause soldiers to end up with many unfired cartridges.

Unfired bullets. Do you have "unfired bullets" in your life? Things you know are important, but have been postponed? What are they? What steps can you take to act on them?

But on <u>Aug. 16</u>, Bible Study will resume onsite, as well as online each Wednesday evening at 7pm.





THE SENSE OF SIGHT is one of the five senses that God has given us to perceive the world around us. But the Bible also teaches us that sight is more than just a physical ability. It is also a spiritual gift that enables us to see beyond the natural, & discern the truth of God.

The Bible contains many examples of people who received sight from God, either literally or figuratively. For instance, God opened the eyes of Hagar, the servant of Abraham, & showed her a well of water when she was in despair in the wilderness. God also opened the eyes of Paul, who was blinded by a bright light on his way to transformed him Damascus. ጼ from persecutor of Christians to an apostle of Christ. Jesus, the Light of the World, performed many miracles of healing the blind during His earthly ministry. He restored sight to Bartimaeus, a beggar who cried out to Him for mercy. He opened the eyes of 2 disciples who were walking with Him on the road to Emmaus, & made them recognize Him after His resurrection.

But not everyone who had physical sight could see Jesus for who He really was. Many people, especially the religious leaders, were blinded by their pride, prejudice, & unbelief. They rejected Jesus as the Messiah & accused Him of being a sinner & a blasphemer. They could not see the signs & wonders that He did, nor understand the Scriptures that testified about Him.

The Bible instructs us to walk by faith, not by sight. God never intended for our sight, or any of our other senses, to become the sole means to discern the truth. There are many things that are invisible to our natural eyes, such as God Himself, His angels, His kingdom, His promises, & His purposes. We need spiritual sight to see these things & live according to them.

Spiritual sight is not something that we can achieve by ourselves. It is a gift that God gives us when we repent of our sins and believe in Jesus as our Lord & Savior. Let us use our sense of sight wisely & faithfully, both physically & spiritually, for His glory & our good.
